

2025 ITF World Tennis Tour Junior Finals – Rules

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1. Competition Format

- 1.1. The ITF World Tennis Tour Juniors Finals shall consist of the following rounds (in the following order):
 - 1.1.1. A singles round robin of eight (8) boys and eight (8) girls.
 - 1.1.1.1. Each shall be split into two (2) round robin groups with four (4) players in each. Players shall be seeded according to the Seed Rankings (ITF Junior World Rankings of the Monday seven (7) days before the start of the tournament week).
 - 1.1.1.2. All matches shall be the best of three (3) tie-break sets.
 - 1.1.2. The 1st and 2nd placed players in each group shall progress to the Semi-Finals. Players from the same group will be placed in opposite halves of the draw, i.e., 1st place in Group A shall play 2nd place in Group B, and 1st place in Group B shall play 2nd place in Group A.
 - 1.1.2.1. The losing players in the Semi-Finals shall compete in a 3rd / 4th playoff match.
 - 1.1.2.2. If a semi-finalist player withdraws prior to the start of their semi-final match, they shall be replaced in the semi-final round by the 3rd place player from their round robin group. E.g., 3rd place in Group A shall replace any player in Group A who withdraws prior to the Semi Final. Where this occurs, the 4th place player in the group shall be deemed as finishing in 3rd, and the alternate will take the 4th place position from that group in the 5-8 playoff draw.
 - 1.1.3. Playoff Matches
 - 1.1.3.1. The 3rd or 4th placed players in each group shall be placed in a playoff draw for positions 5-8. Players from the same group will be placed in opposite halves. I.e., 3rd place in Group A will play 4th place in Group B.
 - 1.1.3.2. The winning players from the Semi-Final round shall compete in a playoff match for 5th and 6th position.
 - 1.1.3.3. The losing players from the Semi-Final round shall compete in a playoff match for 7th and 8th position.
 - 1.1.4. Off-Court Coaching
 - 1.1.4.1 Off-court coaching shall be permitted for all matches, in line with the ITF's Off-Court Coaching Regulations.
2. **Entries for boys' and girls' competitions**
 - 2.1. There shall be 8 boys and 8 girls who shall be direct acceptances into the main draw. In addition, there shall be one (1) alternate player selected in each event.

Acceptances will be determined in the following order:

- 2.1.1. The top seven (7) ranked players in the ITF World Tennis Tour Juniors Finals Qualification rankings as of 8 September 2025 shall be direct acceptances.
- 2.1.2. One (1) player from the People's Republic of China, nominated by the Chinese Tennis Association, shall be a direct acceptance, on the condition that:
 - i) no player from the People's Republic of China has qualified under 2.1.1. above; and
 - ii) the nominated player is in the top 25 of the ITF World Tennis Tour Juniors Finals Qualification rankings as of 8 September 2025;
- 2.1.3. If 2.1.2. is not satisfied, the eight (8) direct acceptance shall be decided by the ITF World Tennis Tour Juniors Finals Qualification rankings as of 8 September 2025;
- 2.1.4. The alternate player shall be from the People's Republic of China provided they are ranked in the Top 75 of the ITF WTT Juniors Qualification Rankings as of 8 September 2025.
- 2.1.5. If 2.1.4 is not satisfied, the next highest positioned player on the ITF World Tennis Tour Juniors Finals Qualification rankings as of 8 September 2025 list shall be designated as the alternate and shall replace any player who subsequently withdraws.
- 2.1.6. The alternate player shall be from the People's Republic of China should there be no alternate in place on 29 September 2025 or should there be a withdrawal on or after 29 September.

3. Withdrawals before the competition

- 3.1. Any withdrawal of a direct acceptance or alternate player before the draw is made shall be replaced by the next highest ranked player according to the ITF World Tennis Tour Juniors Finals Qualification rankings as of 8 September 2025;

4. Draw Process and Standings Calculation Method

- 4.1. The competition shall be divided into two (2) groups of four (4) players each. The competition shall be drawn as follows:
 - 4.1.1. The player seeded one (1) shall be placed in Group A and the player seeded two (2) shall be placed in Group B.
 - 4.1.2. Players seeded three (3) and four (4); five (5) and six (6); and seven (7) and eight (8) shall then be drawn in pairs with the first drawn placed into Group A and the second drawn place in Group B.
- 4.2. Each player shall play every player in his/her group to determine the final standings in each group. Once the draw has been made the ITF Supervisor will draw which lines will play each other on the first day of competition, ensuring that the two highest seeded players in each group do not play in the first match.

Match scheduling

Day 1 – As outlined above

Day 2 – Winners from day 1 matches will play against each other. Losers from day 1 matches will play against each other.

Day 3 – The remaining matches will be played to complete the round robin stage.

- 4.3. The final standings shall be determined as follows and in the following order:
 - 4.3.1. Greatest number of wins; then
 - 4.3.2. Greatest number of matches played. Note: A player with a 1-2 record will be placed higher than a player with a 1-0 record.
 - 4.3.3. If two (2) players are tied, their head-to-head results; or
 - 4.3.4. If three (3) players each have one (1) win, a player having played less than all three (3) matches is automatically eliminated and the player advancing to the single elimination competition is the winner of the head to head of the two (2) players tied with 1-2 records; or;
 - 4.3.4.1. Highest percentage of sets won;
 - 4.3.4.2. if percentage of sets is tied for two (2) players then the head-to-head results for those players; then
 - 4.3.5. If three (3) players remain tied:
 - 4.3.5.1. highest percentage of games won;
 - 4.3.5.2. if after 4.3.5.1. two (2) players remain tied, head-to-head results; then
 - 4.3.5.3. If all three (3) players remain tied after applying 4.3.4.1 and 4.3.4.2, standing will be determined by the Seed Rankings.

5. Default, Retirement and Withdrawal

- 5.1. A player who retires from a match in the round robin due to illness or injury may continue in the competition if certified as fit by the Tournament Doctor and/or Physiotherapist. If the player is not deemed able to continue, they will be replaced by the alternate player.
- 5.2. The alternate player shall take the player's position in the Round Robin or Playoff Stage. Where this occurs prior to the final match of the tournament (e.g. 5th to 6th place), the alternate shall compete in this match and shall receive an additional travel grant amount of \$1,400 USD if they win. In this scenario, the alternate will receive the equivalent of 7th placed ranking points if they win, or 8th place if they lose. Regardless of result, the opponent shall be deemed to finish in the higher position in the final standings for the purposes of the ranking point allocation (see Regulation 7.4). For example, the player originally in the 5th/6th playoff match shall finish in 5th position for the purpose of ranking point allocation regardless of whether they win or lose the final match against the alternate.
- 5.3. Any retirement or default (due to physical condition or dress and equipment) shall count as a straight sets loss for the player.
- 5.4. Any player who is defaulted pursuant to the ITF Code of Conduct during the round robin competition shall be defaulted from all other matches in the knock-out rounds and the default provision of the ITF Code of Conduct shall apply.

- 5.5. Any results recorded against a withdrawing player remain countable for the purposes of the standings calculation, provided there is an alternate available to take their place for all remaining matches in the group.
- 5.6. If there is no alternate player available to begin a round robin stage match, the matches recorded against the withdrawing player will not be counted for the purposes of the round robin standings calculation.
- 5.7. Where no alternate player is available in the playoff stages, the opponent shall receive a walkover win.

6. Travel Grants (all listed in US Dollars)

- 6.1. All direct acceptances who attend the event (8 players in each event), and completes at least one (1) match, shall receive the sum of \$6,500. A direct acceptance who attends the full duration of the event with the intention but does not participate in any matches due to illness or injury shall receive \$3,000.
- 6.2. The alternate player will receive \$3,000 if they remain on-site for the full event duration.
- 6.3. All players, including alternate players, can increase the value of their travel grant payment based on the following:
 - 6.3.1. Any match won in the round robin stage, including retirements and walkovers from their opponent, shall earn a player \$1,750 for each match win.
 - 6.3.2. A player finishing in 1st or 2nd place in the Round Robin group and qualifies for the Semi Finals shall earn an additional \$4,000
 - 6.3.3. A match won in the Main Draw Semi-Final stage shall earn \$4,500.
 - 6.3.4. A match won in the Final shall earn \$2,750
 - 6.3.5. A match won in the 3rd/4th playoff shall earn \$1,750 per match win.
 - 6.3.6. A match won in the first playoff match for positions 5th to 8th position shall earn \$1,400 per win. The same amount shall be earned by the winner of the 5th/6th match
 - 6.3.7. A match won for the 7th/8th match on the final day shall earn \$1,200.
 - 6.3.8. The maximum travel grant payable is \$23,000 should a direct acceptance win all matches in the round robin stage, semi-final and final.
 - 6.3.9. Travel grants of any amount will not be issued to any player who withdraws from the event without a medical certificate from the on-site doctor or physiotherapist.
- 6.4. Travel grants will be paid to players by bank transfer within 28 days following completion of the event. Payment will be made by the International Tennis Federation.
- 6.5. The ITF Director of Juniors, in their discretion, shall have ultimate authority on the distribution of travel grants.

7. Ranking Points

7.1. ITF Combined Junior Ranking Points will be awarded based on round reached. The following table outlines the points that will be awarded:

Winner = 1000 points	Runner Up = 700 points	3 rd Place = 550 points	4 th Place = 490 points
5 th place = 420 points	6 th place = 360 points	7 th place = 320 points	8 th place = 260 points

- 7.2. A direct acceptance who withdraws due to injury or illness prior to the completion of their round-robin group matches shall receive 100 ranking points for each win in the round robin stage, which shall be awarded on a cumulative basis if they have won multiple matches. E.g., 2 wins = 200 points.
- 7.3. A player withdrawing due to illness or injury after completing all matches in the round robin stage will earn 260 points, unless the player qualifies prior to their participation in the main draw semi-finals, in which case they shall receive 490 points.
- 7.4. The alternate shall receive 100% of ranking points for their final position provided they play 2 or more matches. 50% of points shall be awarded if they play only one match.
